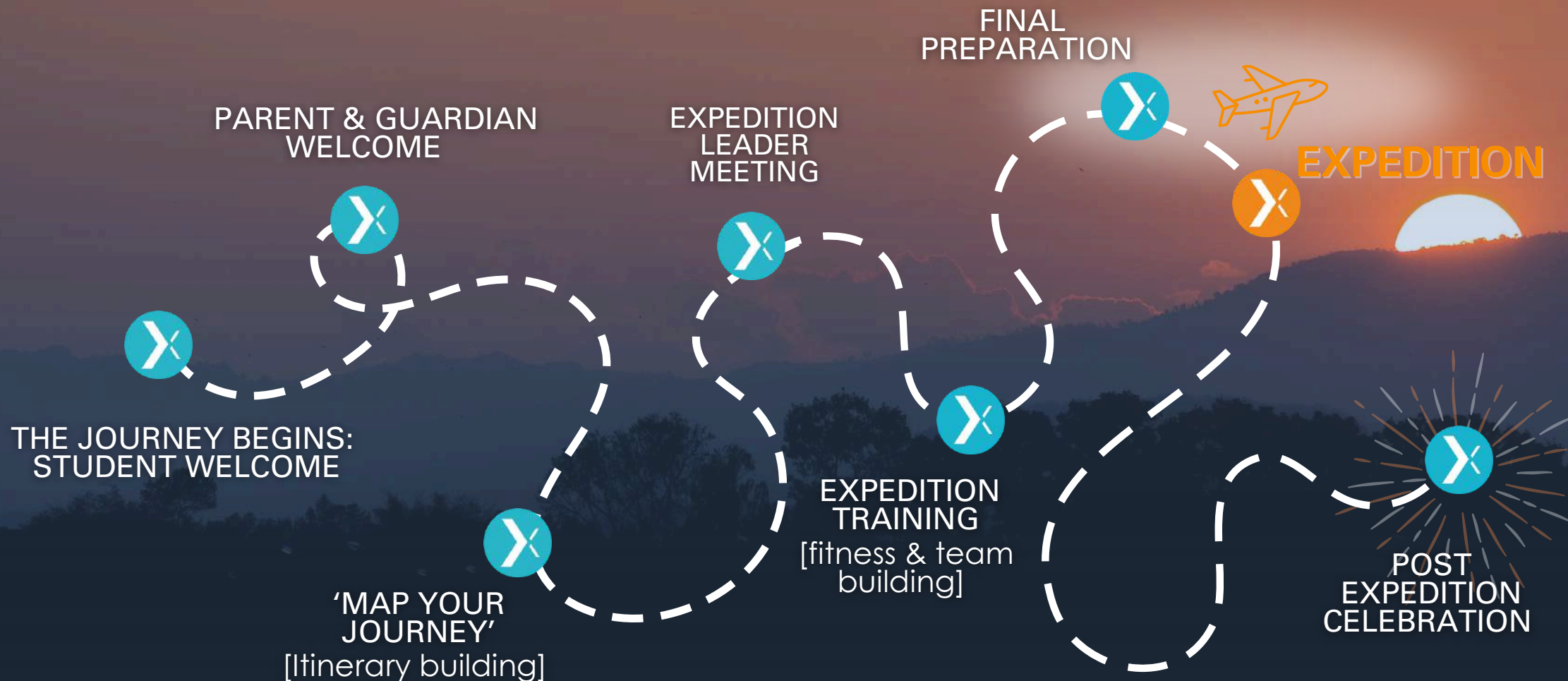

Welcome to Nepal

Known for its towering Himalayan peaks and deep sense of spirituality, Nepal offers one of the warmest welcomes in South Asia. Landlocked between India and China, this culturally rich nation is a tapestry of ancient temples, colourful festivals, and dramatic landscapes that rise from lush lowland plains to some of the highest mountains on Earth.

SAMPLE ITINERARY: 21 DAYS

SEASON: SPRING & AUTUMN ONLY

[other itinerary options are available for this expedition,
in addition to itineraries for expeditions of varying durations]

Day 1 and 2: Fly from the UK to Kathmandu and settle into your accommodation

Day 3: Kathmandu orientation and cultural introduction

Day 4: Transfer from Kathmandu to the community service learning location

Day 5 to 8: Community service learning activities with local projects

Day 9: Private transfer to Dhunche and overnight in a tea house

Day 10: Trek from Dhunche to Chandanbari and begin the Gosainkunda trek

Day 11: Rest and acclimatisation day exploring the Chandanbari area

Day 12: Trek from Chandanbari to Lauribinayak

Day 13: Trek to Gosainkunda Lake and overnight beside the holy lake

Day 14: Sunrise hike to Sury Peak viewpoint followed by trek back to Chandanbari

Day 15: Descend from Chandanbari to Dhunche

Day 16: Transfer from Dhunche to Kathmandu

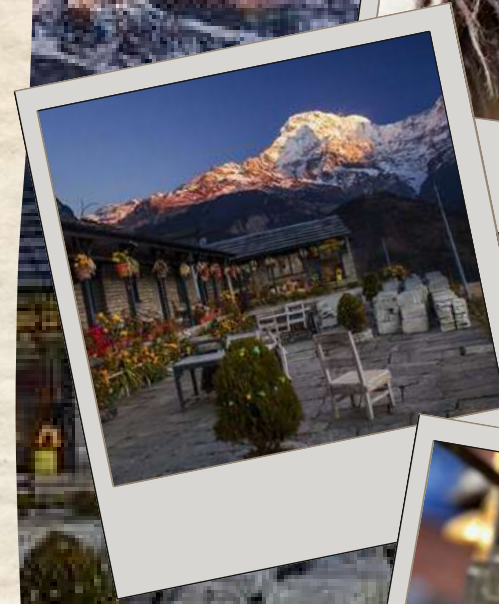
Day 17: Travel to Chitwan National Park

Your Expedition Starts



Day 1-2

Fly from the UK to Kathmandu

Depart the UK on your international flight to Nepal. On arrival in Kathmandu you will be met and transferred to your accommodation. Spend time resting after the journey and getting your first impressions of this vibrant and colourful city.

Day 3

Orientation day in Kathmandu

Enjoy a full orientation day including programme briefings, cultural introduction and preparation for the weeks ahead. Explore parts of Kathmandu and begin to understand daily life, customs and traditions in Nepal.



Day 4

Transfer to community service learning location

Travel from Kathmandu to your community service learning placement. Settle into your accommodation and meet local partners and community members.



Day 5-8

Community service learning

Spend several days working alongside local communities on meaningful service learning projects. Develop practical skills, build strong relationships and gain a deeper understanding of local challenges, culture and ways of life. Time is also built in for reflection and group discussions.



Day 9

Private transfer to Dhunche

Travel by private vehicle to Dhunche, a gateway to the Langtang region. The journey takes approximately five to six hours and offers scenic views of hills, rivers and rural villages. Overnight in a local tea house.



Day 10

Trek from Dhunche to Chandanburi

Begin your trek into the mountains, walking from Dhunche to Chandanburi at 3250 metres. The trek takes around three to four hours and introduces alpine scenery and traditional tea house accommodation.





Day 11

Rest and acclimatisation day in Chandanbari

Spend the day acclimatising to the altitude. Take short hikes to nearby viewpoints, visit local villages and enjoy panoramic views of Everest and surrounding peaks.

Day 12

Trek from Chandanbari to Lauribinayak

Follow scenic trails through forests and along valleys with breathtaking mountain views. Arrive in Tengboche, home to the region's most important monastery, set against a spectacular Himalayan backdrop.



Day 13

Trek from Lauribinayak to Gosainkunda Lake

Continue trekking to the sacred Gosainkunda Lake, an important pilgrimage site set high in the Himalayas. Spend the night in a mountain lodge beside the holy lake.

Day 14

Sury Peak viewpoint and trek to Chandanbari

Hike to the Sury Peak viewpoint for panoramic views across the surrounding mountain ranges, then trek back to Chandanbari. This is a longer day of around seven to eight hours.

Day 15

Trek from Chandanbari to Dhunche

Descend from the high mountains back to Dhunche at 2025 metres, enjoying changing landscapes and warmer temperatures. Overnight in a lodge.

Day 16

Transfer to Kathmandu

Travel back to Kathmandu and check into your hotel. Enjoy a relaxed evening to rest and reflect.

Day 17

Transfer to Chitwan

Journey to Chitwan National Park, known for its wildlife and subtropical landscapes. Settle into your accommodation on arrival.

Day 18

Chitwan safari experience

Spend the day on safari in Chitwan National Park, with opportunities to spot wildlife and learn about conservation efforts.

Day 19

Return to Kathmandu

Travel back to Kathmandu for your final nights in Nepal. Enjoy free time to relax or explore.





Day 20

Kathmandu sightseeing

Explore key cultural and historic sites, visit temples and markets, and enjoy time to shop for souvenirs.

Day 21

Fly back to the UK and arrive home

Depart Kathmandu and begin your journey back to the UK, arriving home with unforgettable memories of your Nepal experience.

The Outlook Way

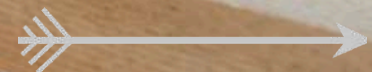
We believe that what we do and how we do it are of equal importance.

How we create an Expedition



EXPEDITION DEVELOPMENT

- We send experienced leaders to potential destinations to undertake recces, for both risk assessments and for expedition development.
- We'll check existing and new accommodation, transport, activities, treks, dives and more.
- We're looking at safety and potential safeguarding risks, as well as assessing the level of challenge and enjoyability.

ITINERARY DEVELOPMENT

- We work with school leaders to understand what the school and expeditioners need and want before a booking is made.
- We share example of existing itineraries, but it is not until we have a team that we together create a draft itinerary closely tailored to the expeditioners' needs and wants, in an Outlook Programme workshop we call 'Map Your Journey'.
- We will continue to refine that until issuing a Final Itinerary a month before travel.
- For our Indi Expeditions [i.e. expeditions not connected with a specific school], we use our experience to create a best-in-class itinerary for the independent expeditioners.
